I predicted the usb stick after I thought we could use eeproms (rewriteable rom) as a hard disk, I'm not sure how they do it nowadays, and I predicted colour lcd monitors after I saw those little lcd computer games in the 1980s. Also I predicted CDs for music after I saw CDs for data storage in computers, or maybe it was the other way around (predicted cd for data in computers after seeing cd for music), can't remember, unfortunately I didn't have a web page back then and I didn't write down my thoughts. In approx 1993 I worked on the mpeg coding algorithm as a paid research project for adfa (mpeg compression/coding then was too slow to playback videos), and nowadays we have windows media player to play videos. I remember the issue back then was, how to quickly find a vector representing the movement (eg panning) of the video from frame to frame so that it wasn't necessary to send the whole frame again, just the changes after movement was calculated. I think they were taking the fourier transform? I didn't fully understand it. But I was able to make the requested changes to the source code, quickly (my supervisor described what he wanted changed), it was written in C I think. But this was only a 10-12 week of work - mostly I haven't done much work.

I remember when I had my project in RSISE (speed control of a toyota landcruiser by remote internet) I set myself an extra project to try and program their mobile robot to automatically acquire a map (using data from its laser range finder). Unfortunately the code didn't work. Every time it moved, the map shifted and walls became doubled and tripled if it was turning, it never managed to synchronize properly the old map with the new map after movement. I'm sure there's some way to do it but I didn't manage to do it. It probably uses complex maths and programming that is beyond my current capability.

For example it takes many years to train to play the piano but if you can play using your mind (if it can recognise notes in your mind) you could learn much faster.

It's about some street dancers that are entering a competition and they have to take in a whole lot of ballet dancers onto their team in order to get a free rehearsal space. When they were playing ballet music and everyone was hiphop dancing, everyone started booing until the hiphop music started, which just goes to show it's not so much the dance moves as the background music, that everyone seems to like.

What I mean by subconscious taking over is for example, I played piano since I was 5 years old until about 14 (classical) and then I did jazz on and off after then, when I played my concert practice rehearsal with the jazz band (bass & drums) I had memorized my 4 pieces and my hands played by themselves I don't know how I did it, I came up with some amazing improvisations and my music teacher said it sounded very musical and good (though he did say I could have tried some double time, 16ths instead of 8ths, and also I forgot to do the introduction for one of my pieces I just started straight into it). But the point is that I can't always play subconsciously, just sometimes. To do that I have to get it as good as I can consciously, and try all sorts of random combinations of improvisations by playing the varying scales over the right parts and changing direction randomly and sometimes starting from some random

other point in the scale and doing little turns and things so it starts off as a random creation that is consciously created and sometimes becomes a subconscious performance that is really good. I think that's how blind people are able to play piano really well sometimes- because the subconscious knows where all the keys are and can do much more than just the conscious which might be fumbling for the right key. I guess maybe I'm talking about left brain vs right brain, left brain is logical and right brain is wholistic and creative, so its about training the right brain to work more instead of just the left brain, that's the old theory but someone said it's been superceded by a better theory nowadays but I can't remember what it was. Anyway whatever it seems to be able to explain why i could play better subconsciously. And I remember when I was in year 12 playing piano in the school band, and I was someone able to play all sorts of complex things without knowing how. I think somehow the subconscious becomes trained to play better than the conscious. Maybe right brain is the subconscious and left brain is the conscious? Not sure. Anyway its fun playing jazz piano. But it's usually a lot of practice of all sorts of funny improvisations and exercises and repetition until eventually something good comes out of the various bits and pieces that I've made up, which are never exactly the same. Well for example I might try walking the left hand up and down the scales, and playing random chords in the right hand, and then playing chords in both hands, and then playing random chords in the left hand and making up melody in the right hand. When I say random I mean, they are random notes but they are within the scale I'm improvising in so not just any note, rather, any note within the scale. This random method seems to hit upon good sounding things every now and then and if it sounds 'out' (sometimes it does) then I can always come back 'in' by doing a purposefully known good chord. Sometimes I play improvisations within a different scale in the right hand to the left hand key, to purposefully go "out" of harmony for a short while, and then shift back "in" again to resolve. I don't know the altered jazz scales but that's another way to do something interesting if you learn them.

Mum says I'm really good at jazz piano. But really I'm a bit out of practice. I was best at it in 1998. From 1999 I stopped practicing. Mum says she will lend me her piano to have in my flat, when I move into public housing. I hope the neighbours don't complain about the noise Lol. Also hopefully it will fit.

I've been watching "the event" on tv, it's a tv series. I just watched episode 7 today (over the internet because I missed it last monday night) and tonight episode 8 is on tv it's on at 10:30pm it used to be at 8:30pm but they moved it later not sure why maybe not popular enough? I think it's a great show. And now it looks like the aliens might be making 7 year old girls look like old woman by sucking the life out of them and putting it into them so they are young still, maybe that's why the aliens don't seem to age. Well that's what it looks like at the moment, it's just a theory but why did the kids look so old that the aliens had captured. And why did the aliens infect the humans on the plane that crash landed, with some sort of disease, which might not have been cured by an antidote (it seems it might just be a temporary antidote).

My internet is fast enough that I can watch youtube without interruption it doesn't pause (only sometimes if I'm having a bad day).
